

# ST. PETER'S WAVE January 2025

## St. Peter's is a community called to Love, Worship, Proclaim, and Serve.

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

The first 5 days of January are the last five days of the Christmas season. I've always found it sad to see Christmas trees discarded by the side of the road before we even get to January 1st. Many are worn out early in January because there has been so much celebrating up through December 25th. Valentine's chocolates and cards are the next commercial products appearing in our stores.

The Church keeps the celebrations going - at least until Lent begins. This year we have 8 Sundays in Epiphany. At St. Peter's we will celebrate Epiphany Sunday on January 5th. The next 4 Sundays will be special Feasts - the Baptism of Christ (12th); the Confession of St. Peter (19th); the Conversion of Saint Paul (26th) and Candlemas (2/2).

St. Paul writes about joy - a gift of the Holy Spirit (see Galatians 5:22). We often hear and sing his words to the Philippians: "Rejoice in the Lord always, again I say rejoice..." (4:4). Could we make this our "New Year's resolution"? To find joy every day in the new year? To rejoice in God's love? To live and share the good news of Christ?

The 1979 Book of Common Prayer introduced 3 openings not included in earlier BCP's. The most often used is the general acclamation celebrating the Holy Trinity. "Blessed be God, Father, Son, and the Holy Spirit...". There is one for use during Lent, "Bless the Lord who forgives...". And one for the Easter season, "Alleluia, Christ is risen...".

There are other traditional opening acclamations for Advent, Christmas, and Saints Days. For a Baptism, we add some additional scriptural verses, "There is one Body and one Spirit... ". Marriages and Funerals have their own unique opening sentences.

The way we start the liturgy sets the tone for all that follows. In the early church the Priest said private prayers. Now this often happens with an acolyte and/or the choir. The opening acclamations affirm the liturgy beginning for all - clergy and congregation.

The Search Committee is updating the profile.

Melissa is reaching out to the pre-school to see if they would like us to volunteer/read to students.

The choir will be caroling at Keystone Sunday, 12/22.
