Dear Parishioners and Friends,

The month of November marks the end of the long Pentecost season which runs for more than six months beginning last May. Some years the first Sunday is Advent ("New Year's Day" for the church) falls in November. This year it is December 1.

Time seems to speed up in November. We turn back the clocks (on Nov. 3rd); we lose sunlight as the days grow shorter, we begin to think about the holiday season approaching.

In the life of the Church, we plan for the new year and we try to wrap up our 2025 Pledge Campaign. Many thanks to all who have pledged.

We begin November by celebrating All Saints - on Sunday the 3rd. We end with Christ the King Sunday (the 24th). The Vestry plans to have one 9 AM service on the 24th followed by a brunch. I hope you will join us for this time of celebration and fellowship before Thanksgiving.

Two special celebrations in our calendar that often get overlooked are St. Andrew's Day (30th) and Samuel Seabury (14th). Andrew was St. Peter's brother. He brought his brother to Jesus, and he introduced many to Jesus. By tradition he was crucified on an X shaped cross and became the Patron Saint of Scotland - thus the X shaped crosses in the Episcopal Church flag and symbol. Samuel Seabury was the first American Bishop who went to Scotland to be consecrated in 1784. He helped to lead the early Episcopal Church in the U.S. and served as the first Bishop of Connecticut.

Enjoy the month ahead and celebrate our many holy days.

Hurricane Relief

The Vestry has designated the loose plate and dedicated check offerings from Sunday, November 24 for hurricane relief to help with the recovery work in those southern states most impacted by the recent hurricanes- Helene and Milton.

We will do this through the work of the *Episcopal Relief and Development*. This fund was established by The Episcopal Church in 1940 and until 2000 was known as the Presiding Bishop's Fund for World Relief.

Those who wish to donate by check can make the check out to St Peter's Church with **E.R.D.** on the memo line. The Vestry may also vote to add to the offerings on the 24th funds from the parish outreach budget.



LITURGICAL NOTES The Great Thanksgiving

The Catechism ("Outline of the Faith") in The Book of Common Prayer p. 859 lists the names for The Holy Eucharist- Lord's Supper, the Mass, Holy Communion, the Divine Liturgy and the Great Offering. Prior to 1979 the B.C.P. used the title "Holy Communion".

The most ancient title for the service is the Greek word "Eucharistia" meaning thanksgiving. The 1979 B.C.P. reintroduced this title and also gave the liturgy two distant parts, The Word of God and The Holy Communion. Sometimes other liturgies are used within or instead of The Word of God; for example Holy Baptism, Marriage, Burial, and Ordination.

The Holy Communion begins with The Great Thanksgiving and one of several options for The Eucharistic Prayer. This begins with the Sursum Corda ("Lift up your hearts…") including the words "Let us give thanks to the Lord…" Prayer B p. 368, echoes this beginning. "We give thanks to you, O God…"

Our national holiday, and Holy Day for the church, Thanksgiving is just a few weeks away. Let us remember that Thanksgiving is not once a year, or even every Sunday at the Holy Eucharist. We give thanks every day remembering St. Paul's encouragement, "give thanks in all circumstances..." 1 Thessalonians 5:18

Spiritual Surprises for the Second Half of Life: An Advent Mini Retreat

Wise leaders and our own experiences tell us that the first half of life is about building up – our homes, our families, our careers and our reputations. The second half of life is more about letting go – downsizing our houses, losing loved ones, retiring from paid work, and becoming aware of our limited time here on earth. Our spiritual priorities also change. Our focus is more on our personal relationship with God and less on sin, dogma and judgement. If you are nodding in agreement or just curious, please join us on **Saturday morning December 7**th from **9:30 – 12:30** in Stephenson Hall for prayer, meditation and conversation about spirituality in the two halves of life. Our reading will be based on the book *Falling Upward* by Fr. Richard Rohr. Coffee and snacks will be provided.

This mini retreat is led by Margery Buckingham who holds a Master's Degree in Spiritual Direction from the General Theological Seminary in New York and a Master's Degree in Applied Spirituality from South East Technological University in Waterford, Ireland. She has provided spiritual accompaniment and retreat facilitation in Massachusetts, Pennsylvania and New York since 2019.



We met with Fr. Bob on October 6th. He had spoken with Rev. Kelly O'Connell, our diocesan consultant, who assured him there are many churches who are still in search for a Rector, especially those that have a part time position available. It would be helpful to assess/increase our finances so we may confidently advertise for a half-time priest.

We remain open to the concept of priest sharing should an opportunity present itself that is in line with our worshiping. One option Rev. Kelly presented was to contact area Lutheran churches. Pastors of these churches may work half-time and be willing to work with us as well. The theology is similar and there have been other Episcopal churches who have called a Lutheran pastor to their parish. After discussion with the Vestry, it was decided that more research into this decision is needed. Another recommendation is to establish contact with senior class representatives from various seminaries to let upcoming graduates know about us.

During our meeting, Matthew asked if the committee might consider appointing someone different to chair our group. Happily, and to everyone's agreement, Larry Higgins agreed to take the lead! We are so glad to have a cohesive group to continue to work together.

We will be meeting on October 29th to review our parish profile, discuss finances, and make plans to explore the options available to our church. We thank you for your continued prayers!
